The Clayton County Library System contributes to the community and its citizens by offering services that meet their informational, educational, and leisure interests. There are six libraries located in the County with 2,992 library programs and over 1/2 million books. The Clayton County Library System is a member of GALILEO, Georgia's virtual library of full-text articles, e-books, journals, educational videos, and more.

Improvements and renovations to the Library Headquarters on Battle Creek Road include roof repairs, updated lighting, and painting the building exterior. The Morrow and Riverdale branch renovations include repairs to the walls and skylights.

Clayton County utilizes more than 700 vehicles in support of public safety operations, including first responder vehicles. As the age (6+ years) and mileage (100,000+) of our first responder vehicles increased, so did annual repair costs. Public safety concerns increased as our fleet aged.

Joint funding was approved to use SPLOST and capital funds to replace two hundred twenty-seven aging public safety vehicles. Priority was given based on vehicle age and mileage. Of the vehicles slated for replacement across the Police Department, Sheriff's Office, and Fire/EMS Department, 210 are funded by SPLOST funding.

Small Business Incubator & Records Center District 1

- Fitness/Wellness Program.





Correctional Facilities Renovations District 4

Update: This project is 75% complete. The contractor is completing final interior finishes and exterior site concrete.

The Clayton County Prison, located in Lovejoy, has a current capacity of 242 inmates. The mainly medium to minimal risk inmates are housed in an open dormitory setting and can participate in work-detail and custodial positions with various Clayton County government agencies.

This project includes the construction of a new dormitory, visitation room, and medical services area. A new transitional area will provide twenty-five beds for work-release inmates. Improvements to the building's interior and exterior infrastructure are slated.

Located on a 21-acre site on Flint River Road, the Flint River Community Center is a collaborative project between the Department of Senior Services and Parks and Recreation. VIP Complex Renovations at International Park District 4

Update: This project is 93% complete. Stadium seating installation is on hold pending fabrication of new seats with a November delivery date. Interior painting is in progress.

Other enhancements include additional covered seating, event administrative space, dressing rooms, additional concessions, re-design of restrooms, backstage facilities, and vendor kiosks.





Upcoming Projects

VIP Amphitheatre: This project is in the design phase. Program needs and design concept are under review. Design by Gardner Spencer Smith Tench & Jarbeau; Construction Firm & Project Completion to be determined.

Nassau Building: This project is 45% complete. Exterior wall sheathing, exterior waterproofing, interior framing, exterior wall framing, and erection of the structural steel are complete. The installation of the metal roof is nearly complete with exterior wall sheathing, interior overhead mechanical installation, and interior framing in progress. This project includes the demolition of the old structure and the building of a new facility. Design and Construction by Brad Construction Company II; Project completion will be Fall 2021.

County Records/Archive Phase II: This project is 25% complete. Pending relocation of Voter's Registration, phased interior renovations will take place after the next two election cycles. Exterior wall pressure washing and prepping are complete, and a primer coat has been applied. Design Firm, Construction Firm & Project Completion to be determined.

Board of Commissioners Administration Building: The project is in the design phase. A three-story option has been selected and floor plans are under review. Design by Nelson Worldwide; Construction Firm to be determined; Project completion will be Winter 2024.

County Fueling Center: Print approval, building color, and signage renderings are all under review. Irrigation and landscape design are pending. Design by Pond & Company; Construction Firm to be determined; Project completion will be Winter 2022.

Fire Station Number 15: A design work authorization request is pending for the architect and engineer. Design Firm, Construction Firm & Project Completion to be determined.

Widening and Reconstruction of Battle Creek Rd/Mt. Zion Blvd. - Districts 4

Update: As clearing continues east to Spring Place, erosion control measures are being installed.

This project includes the widening of Mt. Zion Boulevard just west of the intersections of Valley Hill Road Somerton Drive. The project widens Battle Creek Road at Mt. Zion Boulevard to a four-lane divided highway with a 20-feet wide median, sidewalks, and left and right turn lanes.

Widening and Reconstruction of Battle Creek Road District 4

Update: The removal and disposal of stumps, roots, buried logs, and other debris are 80% complete. As clearing continues, erosion control measures are being installed.

The project includes the widening and re-construction of Battle Creek Road (CR 1342) from Valley Hill Road to Southlake Parkway for approximately 2.11 miles. This project widens Battle Creek Road from the existing two-lane facility to four lanes with a 20-foot wide raised median and urban shoulders including curb and gutter, a 2-foot wide grass strip, and 5-foot wide sidewalks.

Aviation Boulevard/Charles W. Grant Parkway District 2

Update: The beams are installed for the roadway bridge on the west side of the railroad line. Both bridges are 60%, complete with anticipated completion by early 2022. Construction on the final bridge road is anticipated to begin in mid-2022.

The proposed 4-lane facility widens and grades C.W. Grant Parkway under the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Old Dixie Highway. Also proposed is the widening and relocation of Conley Road and Old Dixie Road. The total length of the project is 1.30 miles.
